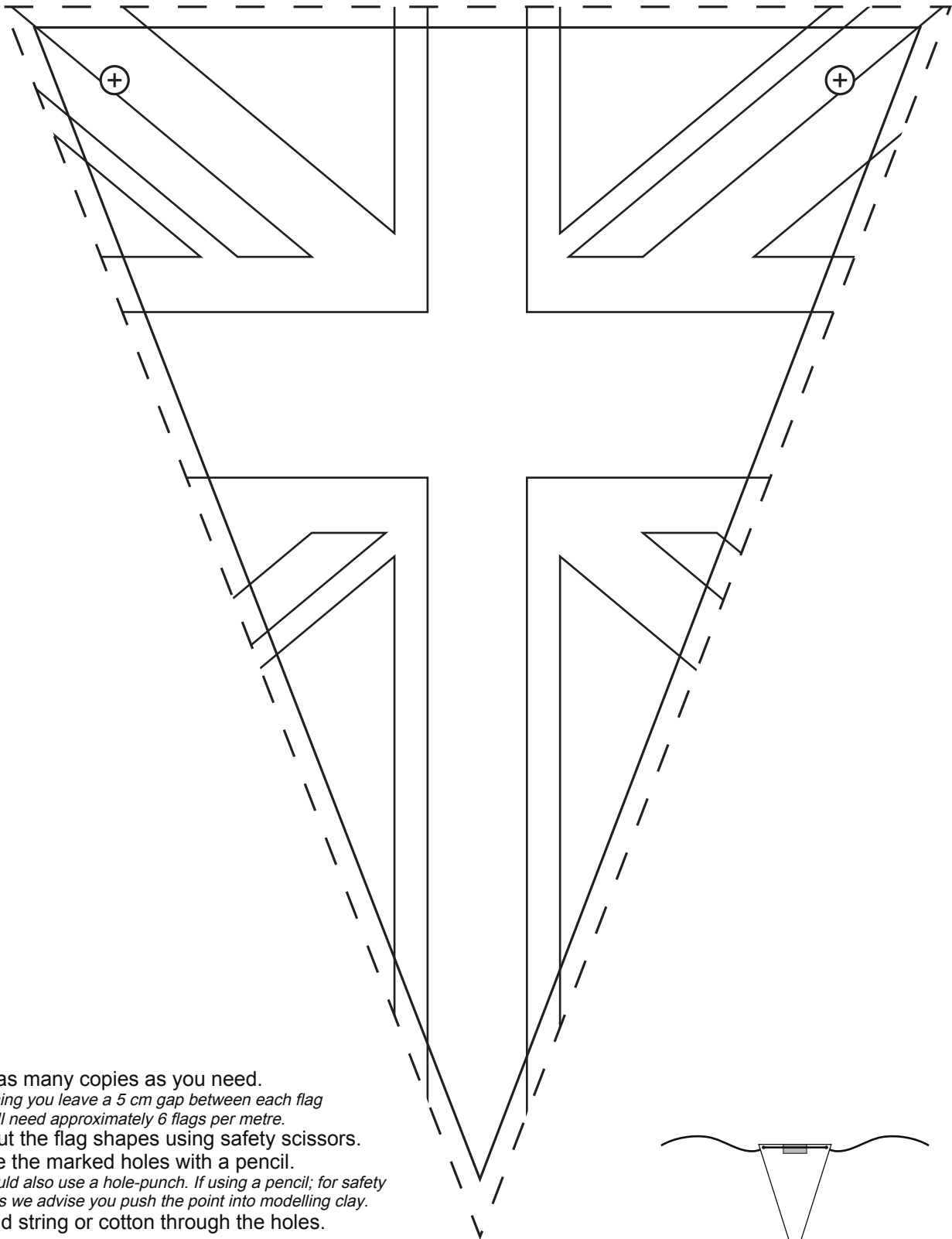
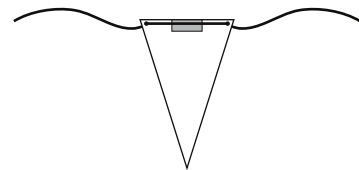


BUNTING FLAG #1: TRIANGLE

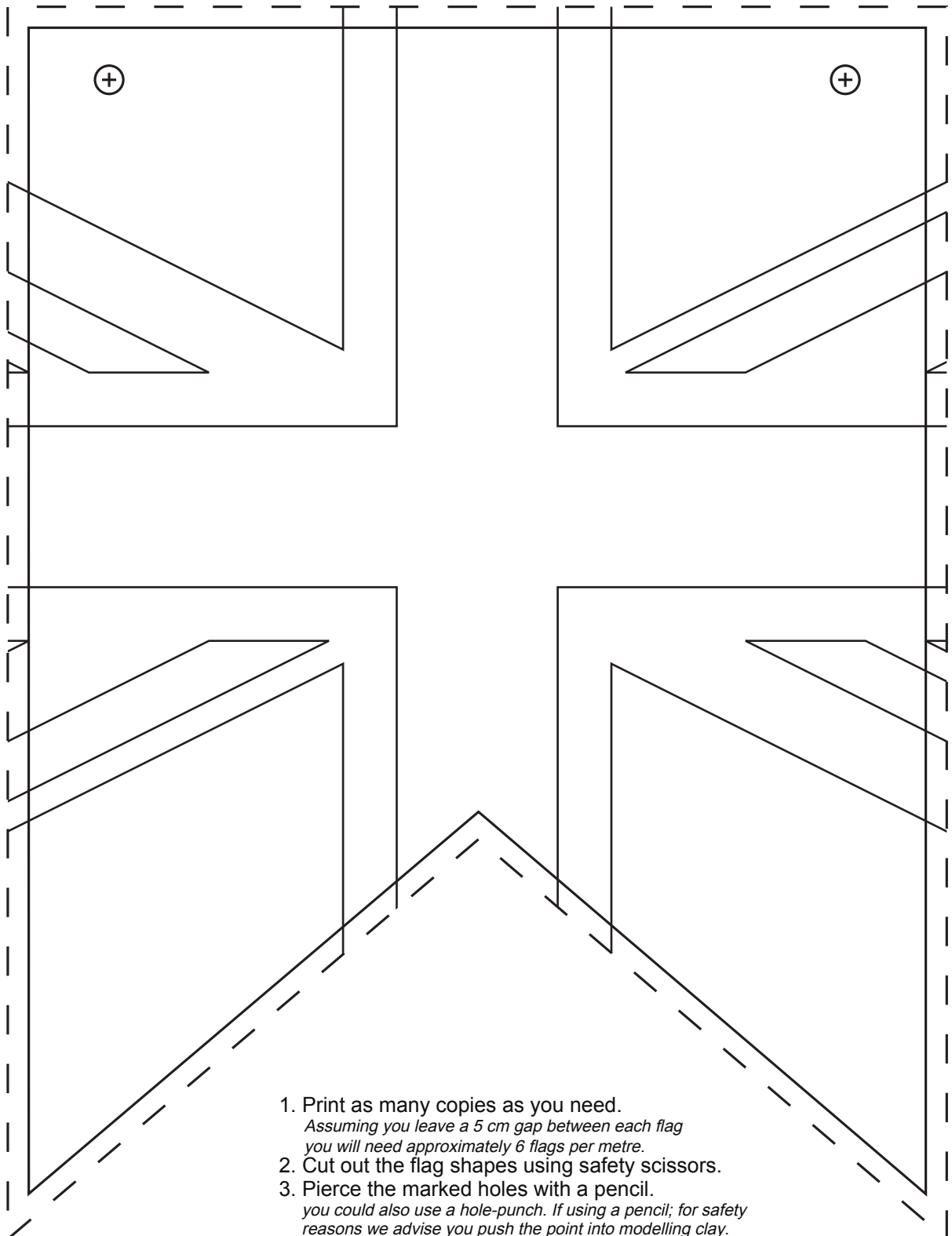


1. Print as many copies as you need.
Assuming you leave a 5 cm gap between each flag you will need approximately 6 flags per metre.
2. Cut out the flag shapes using safety scissors.
3. Pierce the marked holes with a pencil.
you could also use a hole-punch. If using a pencil; for safety reasons we advise you push the point into modelling clay.
4. Thread string or cotton through the holes.

BUNTING FLAG #2: SWALLOWTAIL

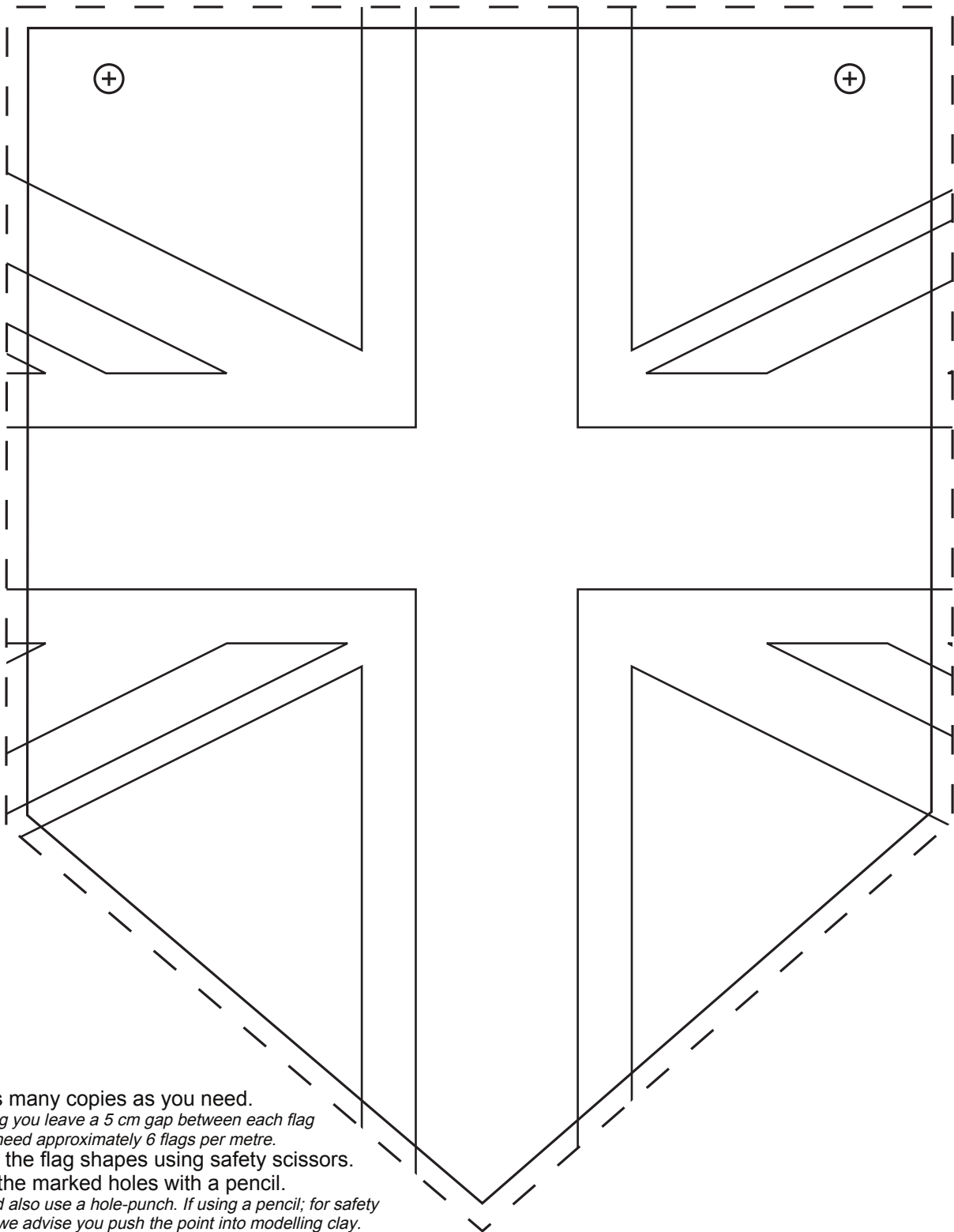
